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Upper Middle/High School Aged Group

- This group is tailored for older adolescents and young adults. 8th grade and into high school is a transitional time where communicative demands increase and become more nuanced in nature. This group will work on cultivating the social communication skills necessary for successful interactions in less structured social situations.
- Ideal ages: 8th grade 12 grade students (ages ~13-18+)

Upper Elementary/Middle School Aged Group

- This small-group program is designed for younger adolescents
 who are developing foundational social communication skills.
 Through structured activities, interactive games, and guided
 peer interactions, participants build confidence in social
 communication. The group provides a supportive, fun
 environment for each participant's communication style and
 developmental level, helping them practice and generalize new
 skills in real-world social settings.
- Ideal ages: 5th grade 8th grade students (ages ~ 10-13)

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Strength Based Assessment: New clients will participate in a brief informal language and social skills assessment before starting any treatment to determine eligibility for groups and correct placement for social skill development. This will include but is not limited to: parent feedback, informal interview, communication with school based services, consultation of student's IEP, etc.

Social Communication Groups: Groups will be composed of three to five children, teens, and/or young adults who are at similar levels in their social thinking and skills. Factors like age, gender, language, and thinking ability are considered when placing groups. Sometimes, kids may be placed with others who are not the same age, but we will always do our best to fit your child's learning style and skill level.
